Quarterly asylum statistics

November 2021

This briefing covers the latest quarterly asylum statistics. For annual and longer term trends see the Refugee Council briefing on asylum trends.

The most recent period for which statistics have been published is the third quarter of 2021. Many of the figures in the last 4 quarters show the impact of coronavirus and the lockdown restrictions and differ significantly from previous quarters as a result.

APPLICATIONS:

• The number of applications for asylum in the UK was higher in Q3 2021 than in the previous four quarters and was the highest quarterly figure since 2003.

Applications by nationality:

 Compared with the corresponding quarter in 2020 there were significant increases in the number of applicants from all but one of the top ten countries of origin. The exception was Sudan. Kuwait has never before appeared in the top ten list.

Applications by location

• The proportion of applications made at ports and in-country changed only marginally before Q2 2020 but increased hugely to 97% in-country in Q2 2020 and remained high, at 89%, in Q3 and then fell to 79% in Q4 but rose again to 88% in Q1 2021, 89% in Q2 2021 and 90% in Q3 2021.

DECISIONS:

- In Q3 2021 3,486 initial asylum decisions were made, excluding dependants; similar to the previous two quarters.
- 70% of initial decisions in Q3 2021 were to grant asylum, an increase on the previous four quarters. 3.3% of initial decisions in Q3 2021 were to grant Humanitarian Protection or Discretionary Leave, and 26% were refusals, a significant decrease from previous quarters.

• Countries with an above average percentage of applicants granted protection in Q3 2021 included Iran, Eritrea, Sudan, Syria, Turkey and Vietnam but refusal rates were high for some countries.

APPEALS:

- 917 appeals were determined in Q3 2021, similar to the last three quarters but still lower than in previous years.
- The proportion of appeals allowed was 44.5% in Q3 2021, while 47% were dismissed. The remainder were withdrawn. The percentage withdrawn was above average in earlier quarters.

ASYLUM SUPPORT:

- The total number of asylum seekers (including dependants) in receipt of Section 95 asylum support at the end of Q3 2021 was 45,857, similar to the previous two quarters.
- 4,917 of these asylum seekers were receiving subsistence only support at the end of Q3 2021.
- 40,490 of these asylum seekers were supported in dispersal accommodation at the end of Q3 2021
- The region of the UK with the largest number of people in dispersal accommodation at the end of Q3 2021 was North West England (8,388).
- 16,794 asylum seekers were in initial accommodation under Section 98 support at the end of Q3 2021, a very large increase from quarters earlier than Q3 2020.

ENFORCEMENT & COMPLIANCE:

Removals (Asylum Applicants)

- In the year ending June 2021 1,119 asylum seekers were removed or departed voluntarily from the UK, a 50% decrease from the year ending June 2020 (2,241).
- 273 asylum seekers left via enforced removals from the UK in the year ending June 2021, an 70% decrease from the year ending June 2020 (908).
- 846 asylum seekers left under Voluntary Return schemes in the year ending June 2021, a 36% decrease from the year ending June 2020 (1,333).

Note: The most recent figures are often revised in subsequent statistical releases, usually upwards, so percentage decreases can change significantly when this happens. The figures for the year ending September 2021 have not yet been published.

Detention

Persons entering and leaving detention

In the year ending September 2021 a total of 21,365 people were recorded as entering detention of whom 16,629 were asylum cases. In the same period 20,878 people left detention of whom 16,400 were asylum cases. Some people may have been in detention more than once.

Persons Detained at the end of Q3 2021

- At the end of Q3 2021 a total of 1,410 persons were detained, at this point there was 1 child in detention.
- 881 persons who had sought asylum at some stage were being detained solely under Immigration Act powers (62% of all immigration detainees).
- 112 children were recorded as entering detention in the year ending September 2021.

CHILDREN:

Applications by Unaccompanied Children Seeking Asylum

• The number of applications from unaccompanied children, excluding dependants, was 1,235 in Q3 2021, higher than in the previous four quarters.

• Iran was the top country of origin for unaccompanied children (30% of all applications in Q3 2021). Afghanistan accounted for 14%, Sudan for 11%, Eritrea for 10%, Iraq for 8%, Syria for 7% and Vietnam for 4%. These seven countries accounted for over 80% of all applications in Q3 2021.

- In Q3 2021 only 6% of applicants were female, similar to recent quarters.
- In O3 2021 74 asylum applications by unaccompanied children were made by girls.
- There are a small number of applications recorded as sex unknown.

Age Disputed Cases

• The number of age disputed cases raised in Q3 2021 was 904, a large increase compared with the previous quarters. Iran (376), Afghanistan (156), Eritrea (85), Sudan (66) and Iraq (64) were the countries of origin with the largest number of age disputed cases in Q3 2021.

N.B. The Home Office statistics on age disputed cases do not include the category of those applicants who claim to be children but who are treated as adult, according to Home Office policy. This used to state that in the opinion of an Immigration Officer "their physical appearance and/or general demeanour **very strongly** indicates that they are **significantly** over 18 years and no other credible evidence exists to the contrary" but the wording has changed since June 2019 to "very strongly suggests that they are 25 years or over".

Decisions

• If an unaccompanied child's claim for international protection is refused, they may be granted UASC leave. Since 2013 this leave is granted in cases where the only reason for giving leave is that the applicant is a child who cannot be returned. It is not granted for anyone over the age of 17 and a half. Decisions on over 18s have increased in recent quarters.

ASYLUM APPLICATIONS (DEPENDANTS):

- In Q3 2021 there were 2,333 dependants included in asylum applications.
- 1,699 of the dependants were under 18 years old and 1,360 were female.

FAMILY REUNION:

Adults who have been granted refugee status or humanitarian protection are entitled to apply for family reunion. Immediate family members, defined as spouses or partners, and children under the age of 18 are eligible to apply for entry to the UK.

The number of cases dealt with has increased from a very small number of cases dealt with in Q2 2020 but that may be partly due to a significant backlog of applications.

WOMEN AND GIRLS:

• In Q3 2021, there were 1,804 applications where the main applicant was a woman or girl. This represents 12% of all applications, lower than previous quarters.

The proportion of female applicants varies considerably from country to country. For a very small
number of countries there are more female than male applicants whereas in many countries the
percentage of female applicants is low. Among the countries with the largest number of female
applicants in Q3 2021 El Salvador, Nigeria, Somalia (and Stateless) have high or above average
percentages.
